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F O R E W O R D

This report provides data on persons employed in the Hotel Industry in The Bahamas by occupation, sex, average hours worked per week and average basic wages per week for the year 2002. The report is based on information obtained from a study of leading hotels, which accounted for approximately fifty percent (50%) of total employment in all hotels operating in The Bahamas in 2002. In this regard the analysis in this report is limited to the hotels that participated in this study. Though limited in this respect, the results do provide valuable information on occupation, average basic wages (not including mandatory and other gratuities for tip category workers) and average hours worked in the hotel sector.

The Department of Statistics wishes to acknowledge the valuable cooperation and assistance of participating agencies such as the Department of Labour, Bahamas Hotel Employers' Association (BHEA) and The Bahamas Hotel Catering & Allied Workers Union (BHC&AWU). The Department also looks forward to and appreciates their continued support.

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DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- **Within the Hotel Industry, Service Workers and Shop and Market Sales Workers was the largest occupational group, accounting for 40% of all workers.**

- **Both males and females worked an average of 39 hours per week.**

- **The average wage in the industry was \$347 per week for the year 2002, up \$25 from the year 2001.**

- **In 2002, the average weekly wage for males was higher than that of females in all major occupational groups.**

- **Senior Officials and Managers earned the highest average wage of \$834 per week, an increase of \$60 over the 2001 wage. This increase was higher than that of the other occupational groups.**

- **The lowest average wage, \$235 per week, was recorded in the Elementary Occupational group.**

- **For males the largest increase in weekly wages of \$123 occurred in the Senior Officials and Managers occupational group. The only decrease, \$41, was recorded in the occupational category of Skilled Agriculture and Fishery Workers.**

- **For females the largest increase of \$46 was recorded in the Plant and Machine Operators and Assemblers occupational group and the only decrease of \$3 took place in the Skilled Agriculture and Fisheries Workers group.**

- **In 2002, the Average weekly wage in the Family Islands including Grand Bahama was slightly higher than the average weekly in New Providence (\$352 versus \$346)**

- **In 2002, several of the occupational groups in the Family Islands including Grand Bahama recorded higher weekly wages than those in New Providence. Senior Official and Managers, Technicians and Associate Professionals and Clerks all earned higher wages than their counterparts in New Providence. On the other hand, wages for Professionals, Service Workers & Shop & Market Sales Workers were higher in New Providence than they were in the Family Islands including Grand Bahama.**
