\$3 Banknote



Front of note

A new \$3 banknote has been introduced and it is important that you know what to look for to verify whether a note is genuine or not.

## Feel



- 1 The characteristic raised print of genuine banknotes can be found throughout the note. This can be felt by running your fingers across various areas of the note such as: the Bank title and the larger \$3 numerals.

## Look



- 2 The watermark of Her Majesty the Queen – the same subject as the printed portrait on the front of the note – along with a lighter area reading ‘\$3’. You can see this from both sides of the note.



- 3 That the security thread is actually a solid line rather than just the windows that can be seen on the surface of the note.

## Tilt



- 4 On the front of the banknote there is figure of 8 knot that changes colour from metallic pink to gold as you tilt the note.



- 5 There is a subtle, lustrous golden band across the back of the note. In this band you can see repeating images of the letters CBB, \$3 and the figure of 8 knot.

## Check



- 6 On the back of the banknote the red security thread can be seen, appearing on the surface of the note in windows and showing images of a sand dollar in yellow and the word BAHAMAS.

- 7 If you look at the note under ultra violet (UV) light, you will see a number of features revealed – on the front you will see a large figure of 8 knot, \$3 and the vertical serial number. On the back, areas of the sea and the sky glow. You will also notice that there are scattered fibres all over the note that show up under UV light.



- 8 There are some areas of the note that just look like plain areas of print or simple lines, but when using a magnifying lens, you will see that they actually read ‘CENTRAL BANK OF THE BAHAMAS 3 DOLLARS’ AND ‘CBB’.
