We refer to the public advisory issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (the Ministry) on 11th February, 2016 indicating that all handwritten Bahamian passports would be cancelled and become null and void as of 19th February, 2016.

To clarify the implications of this advisory on customer due diligence processes, the Central Bank sought the views of the Ministry regarding whether handwritten passports may be used, as appropriate, as a means of confirming identity and facilitating various banking transactions. The Ministry has confirmed that notwithstanding the fact that handwritten passports are no longer recognised as legitimate travel documents, licensees/registrants of the Central Bank are permitted to accept handwritten passports for the sole purpose of facilitating banking transactions and confirming identity.
