
1 The characteristic raised print of genuine banknotes can be found throughout the note. This can be detected by running your fingers across various areas of the note such as: the Bank title, the large \$5 values and the tactile bars.

Look



2 The watermark of Sir Cecil Wallace-Whitfield – the same subject as the printed portrait on the front of the note – along with a lighter area reading '\$5'. You can see this from both sides of the note.

Check



4 There is a subtle, lustrous golden band across the back of the note. In this band you can see repeating images of the letters CBB, '\$5,



5 Optically variable image on the front, which changes its color and information according to the viewing angle and light direction.

Tilt



7 If you look at the note under ultra violet (UV) light, you will see a number of features revealed – on the front you will see 5 and the serial numbers will illuminate. You will also notice that there are scattered fibres all over the note that show up under UV light.
