The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the Central Bank of The Bahamas Act, after consultation with the Bank, makes the following Order ---

**1. Citation.**

This Order may be cited as the Currency (Notes and Coins) (Amendment) Order, 2020.

**2. Amends First Schedule to S.I. No. 112 of 2013.**

The First Schedule to the Currency (Notes and Coins) Order is amended ---

(a) in item 1, by inserting, immediately after paragraph (f), the following as a new paragraph (g) ---

“(g) Predominantly brown with shades of red, yellow and blue, the banknote measures 156mm long and 67mm wide bearing on the front a portrait of Arthur D. Hanna, the series, and the signature of the Governor of The Central Bank of The Bahamas, together with the words “Central Bank of The Bahamas. These notes are legal tender under The Central Bank of The Bahamas Act 2000 for the payment of any amount One Hundred Dollars”. A watermark of Arthur D. Hanna and the numeral \$100, a replica map of the islands of The Bahamas, and the denominational value in words and figures appear on the left, with an image of a Royal Poinciana flower in the centre. The back features a likeness of a blue marlin, with renderings of marine life. The blue marlin is flanked above by the numeral \$100 that appears in the upper left and lower right corners, while the words “One Hundred Dollars” are in the upper right quadrant. Just below the blue marlin is the Coat of Arms of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas along with the words “Central Bank of The Bahamas.”; and

- (b) in item 5, in paragraph (h), by deleting the words “The numeral \$5” immediately after the words “junkanooers adjacent.”, and substituting therefor the words “The Junkanoo cowbeller is flanked above by the numeral \$5 that”.
