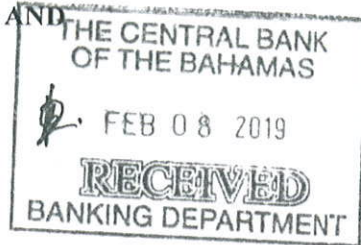

**CENTRAL BANK OF THE BAHAMAS ACT
(CHAPTER 351)**

CURRENCY (NOTES AND COINS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 2019

The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the Central Bank of The Bahamas Act, after consultation with the Bank, makes the following Order ----

1. Citation.

This Order may be cited as the Currency (Notes and Coins) (Amendment) Order, 2019.

2. Amends First Schedule to S.I. No. 112 of 2013.

The First Schedule to the Currency (Notes and Coins) Order is amended ----

(a) in item 2, by inserting, immediately after paragraph (h), the following ----

“(i) Predominantly light blue, with shades of pink, green, orange and brown, the banknote measures 156 mm long and 67 mm wide, bearing on the front a portrait of Sir Roland T. Symonette, the series, and the signature of the Governor of the Central Bank of The Bahamas, together with the words “Central Bank of The Bahamas. These notes are legal tender under the Central Bank of The Bahamas Act 2000 for payment of any amount Fifty Dollars”. A watermark of Sir Roland T. Symonette and the numeral \$50, a replica map of the Islands of The Bahamas, and the denominational value in words and figures appear on the left, with an image of a blooming ‘Frangipani’ in the center. The back features a vignette depicting a rendering of the Central Bank of The Bahamas. The vignette is flanked above by the numeral \$50 that appears in the upper left and lower right corners, while the words “Fifty Dollars” are in the upper right quadrant. Just below the image of the Central Bank of The Bahamas is the Coat of Arms of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas along with the words “Central Bank of The Bahamas”.”; and

(b) in item 6, by deleting paragraph (e) and substituting therefor the following ----

“(e) Predominantly burgundy, with shades of brown, red, lavender, and yellow, the banknote measures 156 mm long

and 67 mm wide bearing on the front a portrait of Queen Elizabeth II, the series, and the signature of the Governor of the Central Bank of The Bahamas, together with the words "Central Bank of The Bahamas. These notes are legal tender under the Central Bank of The Bahamas Act 2000 for the payment of any amount Three Dollars". A watermark of Queen Elizabeth II and numeral \$3, a replica map of the islands of The Bahamas, and the denominational value in words and figures appear on the left, with an image of a Passion flower in the centre. The back features images of sail boats at sea. The images are flanked above by the numeral \$3 that appears in the upper left and lower right corners, while the words "Three Dollars" are in the upper right quadrant. Just below the images of sail boats is the Coat of Arms of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas along with the words "Central Bank of The Bahamas".
