




Back of note




Front of note

A new \$10 banknote has been introduced and it is important that you know what to look for to verify whether a note is genuine or not.

Feel



- 1 The characteristic raised print of genuine banknotes can be found throughout the note. This can be detected by running your fingers across various areas of the note such as: the Bank title, the large \$10 values and the bars at the side of the front of the note.


Look

When you hold the note up to the light you will see:



- 2 The watermark of Sir Stafford Sands – the same subject as the printed portrait on the front of the note – along with a lighter area reading '10'. You can see this from both sides of the note.
- 3 That the security thread appears as a solid line rather than just appearing on the surface of the note in patches.

Tilt



- 4 On the front of the banknote there is a butterfly that changes from metallic green to blue as you tilt the note.
- 5 There is a subtle, lustrous golden band across the back of the note. In this band you can see repeating images of the letters CBB, \$10 and a Blue Marlin from the front of the banknote.
- 6 On the back of the banknote, a portion of the security thread can be seen appearing on the surface of the note showing shifting images of a sand dollar and the number 10. The colours of these images in the thread switch from light on dark to dark on light as you move the note around.

Check



- 7 If you look at the note under ultra violet (UV) light, you will see a number of features revealed – on the front, the Coat of Arms and “\$10” in 2 positions, and on the back, the see-through feature and the 2 flamingos react with fluorescent colour changes. You will also notice that there are scattered fibres all over the note that show up under UV light.
- 8 There are some areas on the note that just look like plain areas of print or simple lines. But when you look at these using a magnifying lens, you will see that they read ‘CBB’, ‘10 Dollars’ and ‘Central Bank of The Bahamas’.
